- Student/Teacher Engagement staff and management have worked consistently over the past three weeks and students have responded really positively. I urge you to continue to support this school/student work. Teachers may assign appropriate work for students to be completed during the holidays, with an emphasis on Leaving Certificate and Junior Certificate groups.
