

## Comeragh College School Uniform Policy

Comeragh College is very proud of its students and the school uniform, which clearly identifies and distinguishes them. Our school uniform is a huge part of our identity as a community of learners. The students of Comeragh College wear their uniform with pride and honour. The manner in which students present and conduct themselves while in uniform reflects significantly on the public image of Comeragh College. Therefore, students wearing our uniform should always be conscious that they represent the entire school community, and as such, their conduct, attitude and manners should reflect our school principles and values (school ethos).

There are many advantages of school uniforms, for example:

- A school uniform instils pride, a sense of belonging and a community feeling in our school.
- It makes it much easier for staff and the public to recognise a student belonging to Comeragh College also to recognise others who do not belong on our school campus.
- Wearing the school uniform reduces social snobbery and peer pressure in school.
- It removes the incidence of inappropriate dress in school.
- It helps our students to learn better as it removes a major source of distraction.

A lot of hard work, research, time and collaboration has gone into choosing the uniform for Comeragh College. Parents and guardians are asked to show their support for Comeragh College by fully co-operating with the school in ensuring that all students wear the full school uniform to and from school every day.

**Health and Safety-** Leather runners required to ensure footwear meets safety requirements in practical classrooms. Students may be timetabled for a practical class on the same day they are timetabled for PE. ## Uniform Code

The school uniform is hugely important in Comeragh College and the Student Support Team to carry out uniform checks in the morning & give students replacement uniform if necessary.

This uniform code will be implemented in the context of our Code of Positive Behaviour.


- ✓ All students are required to wear the full school uniform (as described in this document) **to, from and during** school every day. This includes the correct school footwear and official school tie.
- ✓ Students should change out of their school uniform as soon as they get home in the evening in order to preserve the quality of the uniform.
- ✓ Students should always be aware that they represent our school when wearing the school uniform (**even outside of normal school hours**). Any poor conduct whilst wearing our school uniform has a potential impact on the image of Comeragh College and **may** result in disciplinary consequences (in accordance with our Code of Positive Behaviour).
- ✓ It is expected that the uniform is kept clean and maintained to the highest standards and that students wear it with pride.
- ✓ Students should also maintain high standards of personal hygiene at all times.
- ✓ All students are required to wear the full school uniform when representing the school on school trips/activities. Any student who is does not present in the appropriate uniform will not be permitted to represent the school or go on the school trip/outing.
- ✓ On occasion, the P.E. uniform **may** be permitted for sporting outings. Parents will be informed in advance when this is deemed necessary. Once again, students who are not dressed in the appropriate school P.E. uniform/ school uniform will not be permitted to travel.


- ✓ Shoes must be kept clean and polished. (failure to wear the correct shoes will result in students not travelling to or attending an out of school activity)
- ✓ Only the school uniform may be visible, ie other items of clothing not to be seen. The school tie must we worn at all times.
- ✓ During the school day, non-uniform items of clothing must be stored in the locker.
- ✓ It is the responsibility of each parent/guardian to ensure that each item of their son/daughter's **uniform is labelled clearly** with their childs's name. A waterproof marker should be used.
- ✓ Students are responsible for their own property. Students to report missing items on the day. The school does not accept responsibility for lost, stolen or damaged uniforms.

**Important Notes:**

1. It is imperative that all students comply fully with our uniform code. On the occurrence of an isolated incident where a student is unable to wear their correct uniform, parents/guardians should write an **explanatory note** in the notes section of the student's diary. The student should present this note to their Director before 8.50am. In the case where the school has a stock of the missing item of uniform, the student will be loaned the item for the day.
2. All students are expected to present in either school uniform or school tracksuit each day. No casual clothes unless for exceptional circumstances.
3. Medical issues- where a student has a medical issue and cannot wear the uniform, a doctor's note is required. Medical notes to be presented to Directors.
4. Persistent infraction of the uniform code will result in the parent/guardian being contacted to come and take the student home until they comply fully.
5. Parents/guardians should contact the school if they are experiencing difficulty in acquiring the uniforms.
