

CHRISTMAS STUDY TIMETABLE 2025

You have 16 days off school over Christmas. You should spend at least 3 hours on each subject. This gives a total of 21 hours. You could divide this over 7 days with 3 hours per day or over 4 days with 5 hours 15 minutes per day. You could study each subject in 1-hour slots over 3 days and study contrasting subjects each day. Use the below timetable to plan and write in which subjects you will study, which days and at what time each day. On the next page write the details of which topics you want to cover over Christmas for each subject. Decide which days you will keep free and stick to them. *Following this will really help you to prepare for the mock exams and to feel confident coming up to the exams along with avoiding feeling stressed. You will have five weeks of school before the mock exams when you return to school after the holidays.*
